## BEATTY CLUB (RAY MAY AND MAE MAY) - BEATTY

Mr. Sinnott read the following report into the record concerning the Beatty Cluh:

"Briefly, the story is this. On the night of March 25, an agent for the Gaming Control Board entered this club on a routine card pick-up and inspection. He took from a dealer a deck of cards, sealed them in an initialed envelope in the usual manner without inspection, left the premises, proceeding to Las Vegas.

The following morning the dealer appeared at the Carson office of the Board and recited that the cards picked up from him had been tampered with by bending the high cards. (A teletype to our Las Vegas office confirmed this.)

The dealer explained the presence of the cards by saying a crossroader had played the night before and the dealer had pulled the deck in question and another deck which he placed in a drawer. He forgot to remove them and on the night in question picked up one of the decks and started dealing to his wife, who was shilling. The decks were never in play and no money changed hands.

The licensees, Ray and Mae May, were served with a show cause order for appearance April 16. They were cited for:

Operating a cheating game
Having in possession a deck of cards tampered with in such a manner as to
enable them to be used for cheating
And conducting the business by unsuitable method of operation

Testimony was taken from the Board agent, the dealer, and the licensees, who were represented by John Squire Drendel, of Reno. The licensees denied knowledge of the bent cards, but did claim knowledge of the crossroader's presence on the night of the 24th. Neither licensee is familiar with the gaming business."

After discussion of the case, the Board found that the evidence did not show that the licensees operated a cheating game, but did have in their possession a deck of tampered-with cards. The Board noted that the type of bend used is more common to outside cheating than inside cheating. The Board found that the games were conducted by unsuitable method of operation.

Mr. Sinnott made a motion, which was seconded and carried, that the Board recommend to the Commission that the licensees can be held to be responsible for having in their possession a deck of cards tampered with in such a manner as to enable them to be used for cheating and thereby conducted the business by unsuitable method of operation; and that the gaming license of the Beatty Club be suspended for thirty (30) days commencing from March 28, 1957, the date on which the games were voluntarily closed.

#### RIVER VALLEY RESORT - DAVIS DAM

Mr. Gallagher brought up for clarification the application for a slot machine license at the River Valley Resort, along the Colorado River. After discussion, a motion was made and passed to defer action on the application pending determination of the attitude of local authorities.

## LAKE TAHOE MONTE CARLO, INC. (GEORGE M. ABDO, THOMAS J. ABDO, AND RICHARD J. MILLER) - LAKE TAHOE

Messrs. George M. Abdo, Thomas J. Abdo, and Richard J. Miller, accompanied by their attorney, Mr. Bert Goldwater, appeared in behalf of their application for a license at Lake Tahoe Monte Carlo.

There was considerable discussion concerning the proposed financing for the club and sources of loans. There was also discussion concerning any interest, financial or otherwise, which Mr. David Miller, father of Mr. Richard Miller, might have in the club. When Board members expressed concern over the ability of the corporation to meet its financial obligations, especially in July, the applicants were permitted time for further conference on the matter. Later plans were presented to the Board for further financing. Mr. Miller reiterated that his father, David, would have no interest, financial or otherwise, in the gambling operation. He stated that it was planned, however, that his father would supervise the restaurant operation.

Following further discussion, it was moved by Mr. Sinnott and passed that the license be recommended for approval subject to the terms and financial conditions present in the record as put forth by the applicants; and that David Miller have no interest, direct or indirect, whether financial, administrative, policymaking, or supervisory, in or about the premises; and that their license not be issued until the financial requirements have been met.

A verbatim report of the hearing is available in the office of the Gaming Control Board.

TRAIL "40" CAFE & BAR (OTTO L. CARD AND EVERETT E. SMOOT) - WELLS

Messrs. Otto L. Card and Everett E. Smoot, applicants for a license at Trail "40" Cafe & Bar, accompanied by their attorney, Jack E. Hull, appeared before the Board in behalf of their application.

Mr. Hull stated that Mr. Card, as lessee, was to supply the premises and financial backing, while Mr. Smoot would conduct the gambling operation. ### OLD CATHAY CLUB ( HARRY CHON) - RENO

The following record, findings, and conclusions concerning the license of the Old Cathay Club, Harry Chon, licensee, were introduced into the record:

The following is offered the Tax Commission for guidance in analyzing the voluminous transcript of the captioned inquiry. The transcripts and documents speak for themselves.

Board interest in the Old Cathay Club stemmed originally from a denial of a 1956 license to Horace Fong to operate an establishment called the Lido Club, subsequently the Confucius, and now called the Old Cathay. Mr. Fong was to be associated in the original venture with a Bay Area gambler, his god-

father, Young Ah Fook, or more commonly known as Moon Wah, a man recently convicted of income tax evasion in California. Mr. Fong had no gambling experience; Moon Wah was to supply this.

Following the denial, Mr. Fong and Harry Chon, presently licensed, applied for a license. This was again denied by the Tax Commission as to Fong, but without prejudice to Chon.

Thereafter, Mr. Chon applied individually for a keno operation on the basis of a fixed rental lease with Horace Fong. This was subsequently expanded on August 28, 1956 and an unrestricted license for the Lido Club was granted to Chon, who, according to the application was putting \$7,500 into the venture. It is noted that this was separate and distinct from the Bar and restaurant which remained as Horace Fong's.

Investigation was initiated into the club's operations on the basis of complaints received that there might be unreported changes of interest.

Pursuant to the investigation a show cause order was issued April 9, 1957 calling for appearance April 16, 1957 at 2 P. M. For cause presented by Mr. Clark Guild, Jr., attorney for the club, this was postponed until April 24, 1957. The show cause order specified five charges: That the licensee -

(1) Transfered interest to an unlicensed person.

(2) Made misrepresentations on his application to the Gaming Control Board pertaining to the financial structure of the club.

(3) Maintained bankroll improperly.

(4) Permitted concealed interests in the club.

(5) Conducted the business by unsuitable methods of operation.

At the hearing an agent for the Gaming Control Board and a Reno police officer testified that Harry Chon, the licensee, told them on March 13 that he had hired Fred Down as manager and that Down had hired George Chin over Chon's protest.

The licensee told the agent and officer that he had nothing to say about employment in the business, operation of the business, that he had no idea what his bankroll was from day to day, that he did not have access to the safe, which was controlled by Fred Down who had the combination. Chon told the agent that his advice to Down was ignored, and that he was going to confer with his attorney if certain individuals were not removed from the club and that he would voluntarily close, which he did March 15, 1957.

Present for the closing were the Gaming Control Board agent and the Reno police officer. Fred Down at this time opened the safe and gave Chon about \$7,000 from it which Chon deposited in the bank in the casino account. At this time Chon informed the agent and officer that he had originally in the bankroll \$18,000 (the original application called for \$6,800 bankroll, then \$7,500). Actually, \$20,000 had been put in after borrowing from outside sources, the notes for which were not maintained with the Old Cathay books and were recorded only in a small notebook maintained on Mr. Chon's person.

The Reno police officer testified also that Harry Chon on March 22 had contacted him and asked him to retrieve \$3,500 of the money deposited in the bank by Chon which Fred Down now claimed as his personal money. Down had drawn a check for this on the Old Cathay account three days after he had given the money to Chon after the club was closed.

The auditor for the Gaming Board outlined his findings after an audit of the Old Cathay in conjunction with the Reno officer and the Board agent. He testified that at the beginning of the operation November 6, 1956, Harry Chon was the signer of checks disbursing funds. Before the end of November the checks were signed by Fred Down. He said also that \$18,000 was placed in the bankroll and that notes representing this money were not recorded.

Mr. Chon testified categorically denying that he told the agent and police officer that he had no control in the club, that he could not hire or fire, that Fred Down would not follow his advice. He said that he discussed one employee, George Chin, with Fred Down, the manager, who might cause trouble from the Gaming Board or the police department, but that Chin was a friend of Down's and that Down would take care of the matter later. He admitted not having the combination to the safe and explained that this was a method of saving the money since he spent it when he was drinking. He said he was in San Francisco about three days of the week, in and out to take care of the grocery store there. He described difficulties in the clubas being based on the fact his lease was being cast in doubt by Horace Fong's subleasing to Shew Chee Young, Moon Wah's son, and Fred Down, who were already in the process of assuming the bar and restaurant operation.

Horace Fong testified to having no interest in the Old Cathay. He said he was co-signed on a note to Clyde and Harry Beecher for Chon. He testified that he did not know Shew Chee very well although Shew Chee was the son of his godfather, Moon Wah. George Chin testified that he had no interest in the Old Cathay.

A Reno accountant testified for the licensee. He said that money in the safe was co-mingled; that \$3,500 of it was claimed by Down, who, without Chon's knowledge had drawn a check on the Old Cathay account. Chon admitted not knowing whose money it was and that he would rely on the accountant to determine this.

Fred Down testified that he had no interest in the club and that the \$3,500 was his personal money.

# THE BOARD FINDS:

- (1) That the licensee showed there was no transfer of interest in the club although strong doubt surrounded control of the casino.
- (2) That there was no misrepresentation on the licensee's application, but additional funds by loans had been placed in the bankroll after licensing and, contrary to rules, the notes representing these loans were not maintained with casino records, or carried in the records.
  - (3) That the licensee did not permit a concealed interest in the casino.
- (4) That the licensee maintained his bankroll improperly and admitted his own incompetence to control it.
  - (5) That the licensee conducted the business by unsuitable method of operation.

### CONCLUSION OF LAW:

The Board finds that the licensee is an unsuitable person to hold a license, and recommends unanimously that the license be revoked.

It was moved by Mr. Gallagher and passed that the findings of fact and conclusions of law concerning the Old Cathay Club, as entered into the record, be approved.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 12:40 p. m., subject to the call of the chair.

EL MOROCCO CLUB ( OSCAR L. CROZIER, BARNEY MEYERS, RUBEN BULLOCK, JR., OTTO BRUNNER, ORLONDO P. GRADITI, S. L. MARTINEZ, VERNON DALLMAN, JR., JOE PADILLA, AND LOUIS L. HIRSCHORN) - LAS VEGAS

Barney Meyers, Ruben Bullock, Jr., S. L. Martinez, and Oscar L. Crozier, applicants for a license at the El Morocco Club, together with Joseph Hornstein, a prospective applicant, and their attorney, Clark Guild, Jr. appeared before the Board in behalf of their applications. Also present was Mr. Richard Plaut, formerly associated with the old El Morocco Corporation.

Mr. Guild explained the organization, financing, and plan of operation for the proposed limited partnership of the El Morocco.

Both Mr. Crozier and Mr. Plaut were questioned about their past association with the old El Morocco Club organization. Mr. Hornstein was questioned at length concerning his connection with Ted Lewin, Far Eastern gambler and president of the Far Eastern Steamship Company, major owner of the El Morocco Club building, and his future plans in the El Morocco Club operation. Mr. Hornstein admitted he planned to come in as an applicant at a later date and, although he had promoted the organization of the club, his name did not appear on the application because of marital difficulties. Chairman Cahill pointed out that since it was evident Mr. Hornstein intended to be an applicant on this license that in view of his past experience with the Tax Commission, the application should be considered with his name on it. Mr. Hornstein agreed to submit an application at once. It was decided by the Board to hold the application as incomplete.

SILVER SPUR - CARSON CITY

Attorney Richard Waters, Jr., representing Messrs. Floyd Douglas, M. R. Arnold, and Ray Christian, partners in the Silver Spur, appeared before the Board to report a change in the organization of the club from a partnership to a corporation. Mr. Waters filed with the Board the articles of incorporation and stated that the ownership of the corporation was exactly the same as in the partnership. Mr. Waters' statement was accepted as a matter of record.

## CALIFORNIA CLUB ( GEORGE CHIN) - RENO

Mr. Chin, with his attorney, Clark Guild, Jr., appeared before the Board in behalf of his application for a license at the California Club. Mr. Guild outlined the proposed plan of operation for the California Club, stating that Mr. Chin would lease the rear of the premises from Fred Down, operator of the bar and restaurant. A discussion was held concerning the past history of the propsed California Club, previously known as the Lido and Old Cathay, we well as Mr. Chin's connection with this club and his activities in the Yukon Club. It was pointed out that the licenses of both the Old Cathay and Yukon had been revoked.

It was moved and passed that the application be denied because of Mr. Chin's past unsuitable operations.

After subsequent discussion, the Board agreed to defer action on the application because of questions concerning the financing, sale of stock, Mr. Mitzel's lack of gambling experience, and the incompleteness of the casino construction.

### TROPICANA HOTEL - LAS VEGAS

Board and presented a letter setting forth the progress to date in the Kastel matter. The letter stated in substance that the hotel had been in operation only four months and therefore did not have sufficient accummulated earnings to retire the Kastel indebtedness; that because of an income tax situation Mr. Kastel is unwilling to accept the full balance owed him; and that a notice of levy has been served upon the hotel by the Bureau of Internal Revenue pursuant to which the United States has prior claim to a portion of the money due Mr. Kastel. The idea of setting aside a portion of the unsold capital stock of the corporation for the payment of this indebtedness was favorably received, but unfavorable publicity directed toward the hotel has not been an inducement for present stockholders to increase their investment nor for the sale of the balance of the capital stock.

Mr. Cahill stated that this letter seemed to add nothing new to the situation other than pointing out reasons why the hotel has been unable to sever connections with Mr. Kastel.

Mr. Brown was informed that the letter would be presented to the Tax Commission for its consideration.

# THE COMSTOCK HOUSE (CLAUD D. FARMER) - VIRGINIA CITY

Mr. Sinnott presented the following report on the Comstock House, Virginia City:

On June 26, 1957, a Gaming Control Board agent observed the dealer in the above club peeking and dealing second cards.

On August 5, 1957, two other Gaming Board agents observed the dealer peek and deal second cards.

On August 8, 1957, a show cause order was served on Claud D. Farmer, the licensee, charging there was operated on the dates specified a cheating game, contrary to the provisions of Section 34 of the Newada Gaming Control Act of 1955, and that the business was operated by unsuitable method of operation.

A hearing was held on August 15, 1957 in Carson City. Mr. McKissick represented the Board. The three agents testified to their observations.

Mr. Farmer testified in substance that he had worked hard to make the Comstock House successful and the only way he could be recompensed for this would be in the future. He denied any knowledge of a cheating game in his establishment, saying he wished no 21 game to interfere with his ambitions for the establishment. He closed the game on notice of cheating and said he intends to keep it closed.

The dealer testified he had never been told by Mr. Farmer to cheat and denied cheating at the times specified. The dealer's attitude in his testimony did not inspire confidence.

The Board finds that Mr. Farmer did not show cause why his license should not be revoked or suspended. Lack of knowledge of a cheating game on the part of a licensee is no excuse. The total responsibility for casino operation rests on the licensee. There is no reasonable doubt there was cheating in this casino. Mr. Farmer based his presentation on lack of knowledge of this cheating game.

Therefore, the Board recommends that the license of the Comstock House be revoked.

A motion was made, seconded, and carried that the recommendation be adopted.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 12:20 p. m., subject to the call of

Mr. Guild outlined to the Board the terms of a pre-incorporation agreement according to which the applicants agree to form a corporation known as the Markey Corporation and to which Lewis Hirschorn and Joseph Hornstein agree to execute a lease of the El Morocco Club premises in the event a license is granted the applicants. Mr. Guild emphasized that Mr. Hornstein would have no interest in the venture except as a landlord of the premises. Mr. Guild also outlined to the Board the financial situation of the operation. It was brought out that the proposed total investment of \$130,000 was not yet available, but that the remainder, according to the terms of the pre-incorporation agreement, would be paid upon licensing. Discussion also brought out that the application of one of the applicants, Donald Compton, was still incomplete.

A motion was made by the Board and carried that the application of the individuals shown on the application be approved subject to the following conditions: that the contributions of each applicant, as represented on the application, be placed in escrow and that in the event any one of the applicants fails to contribute his proportionate share of the capital or withdraws from the application, that the sum total of \$130,000 must still be met within the group; and that Mr. Compton's approval be separate and apart from the others, conditioned upon clearance of prints and bank confirmation.

### PASTIME CLUB (GEORGE C. BOBBITT) - TONOPAH

Attorney William Crowell was requested to appear before the Board to discuss questions concerning the past associations and source of finances of his client, George C. Bobbitt, applicant for a license at the Pastime Club, Tonopah. In order to clarify these matters further, it was decided at this time to grant only a restricted license for eight slot machines and to defer the nonrestricted license.

### BRANDING IRON (FRANK A. WIELAND) - RENO

The following report was submitted on the Branding Iron, Frank A. Wieland, licensee:

This investigation was predicated on observations made by a Gaming Control Board agent on routine patrol in Reno on the evening of August 30, 1957. He observed that the dealer, a woman, was second carding, but gave no indication of peeking, implying the cards utilized were tampered with in some way.

Under instruction, on August 31, two agents picked up the cards in the establishment, sealed them in an identified envelope, and brought this evidence to the Gaming Control Board office. (It developed that the dealer had no current Washoe County work permit.)

Examination in the Board's presence, after unsealing the envelope, revealed that the cards were crimped on the corners. The aces, tens, and face cards had a down crimp in the corner; the small cards had an up crimp; all cards were tampered with. They could be read without difficulty.

A show cause order was prepared citing that the Branding Iron operated a cheating game, had in possession a deck of cards tampered with so as to enable them to be used for cheating, and conducted the business by unsuitable method of operation. A hearing was set for September 10 and then reset until September 16 at the request of Clark Guild, Jr., representing the Branding Iron.

A subpoena prepared for the dealer was not served and returned to the Gaming Board marked "not found."

Mr. Springer represented the Board. Testimony from the Board agents during the hearing was as set forth above.

The club presented five witnesses: two of them from Stead Air Force Base, friends of Mr. Wieland, the licensee, and patrons of the establishment; a cocktail waitress; an accountant; and the licensee. The airmen testified to seeing a red headed man playing on August 31st and tampering with the cards by crimping them against the table. One demonstrated this by bending one corner up and one corner down on the same card.

The waitress testified that the licensee on the night in question had asked her did she know the

red headed man who was playing. The licensee told her that the man had won some money and that the licensee thought it looked fishy.

The accountant introduced accounting records covering the period in question showing a loss.

The licensee testified that he saw the red headed man playing on August 31st. He said he saw the dealer and the man talking and the dealer pointing to the cards, after which the red headed man picked up the silver and left without cashing in. The licensee discussed this with the dealer who said the man was "monkeying around" with the deck a little bit. The licensee took no action after this and did not inspect the cards when the player left. He testified that the two Gaming Board agents entered the club and picked up the cards fifteen minutes after the player left. He testified further that the dealer disappeared the night the cards were picked up and was not located by him and is still owed three days' pay.

The Gaming Board finds that the Branding Iron and Frank A. Wieland, licensee, operated a cheating game at the time specified, had in possession a deck of cards tampered with so as to enable them to be used for cheating, and conducted the business by unsuitable method of operation.

Therefore, the Board recommends that the license be revoked.

A motion was made by Mr. Sinnott, seconded and unanimously carried, that the Board recommend to the Commission that the license of the Branding Iron be revoked.

# SANS SOUCI, LAS VEGAS

Since the Securities Exchange Commission requires strict adherence to any conditions established by the Gaming Board and Tax Commission, Mr. George E. Mitzel, licensee of the Sans Souci, has requested that the condition imposed at the time of the licensing of the Sans Souci be amended to permit sale of corporate stock to persons who have made loans to the corporation or George E. Mitzel (as per a list of eight people furnished). The condition as originally imposed permitted sale of stock to only stockholders or subscribers of record.

Mr. Gallagher made a motion, which was seconded and unanimously passed, that this amendment be recommended to the Tax Commission for approval.

#### RULES AND REGULATIONS

### Add to Rule 3.950:

The board may require a licensee to secure future wages or salaries as a condition precedent to issuance of any license, or at any time the board shall determine that it would be in the public interest. The sum shall be estimated to equal the licensee's total payroll of employees of every

ass for wages and salaries covering such pay periods as the board may fix. The security may take e form of special deposit in commercial or savings accounts in a Nevada bank or U. S. securities yable to bearer. The form and amount of security shall be certified in writing to the board by the censee and the depositary. Such deposit shall be held as security for wages and salaries until ordered leased by the board upon application of the licensee to the board.

### d new Rule 6.060

"Gross Revenue" as defined in subparagraph (m) of Sec. 2 of the Nevada Gaming Control Act levada Revised Statutes Section 463.020) shall be computed without reference or deduction for any rect or indirect prizes, drawings, awards, benefits or other promotional allowances except cash rectly paid out as a result of a specific wager.

### id to Rule 3.060

In the event a person owns, controls or has an interest in a gaming establishment outside the State Nevada in a state or country where gaming is legalized under the laws of such other state or country, e board may, in the public interest and at its discretion, refuse to license, or further license such erson in this state.

# dd new Rule 8.130

In all cases, the approval of the board must be obtained before any cash, property, credit or any rm of security by a licensed gaming establishment, or any licensee, employee or agent of a licensee e obtained, used or accepted from any person or business entity, including other licensees, the purpose which cash, property, credit or security is to aid or supplement the casino reserve, directly or inrectly, regardless of the method, place or person using, receiving or maintaining such cash, property, redit or security. Any violation of this rule shall constitute grounds for revocation of license.

In recommending for approval seasonal applications, Mr. Gallagher offered the following ession of policy, which was concurred in by the other two Board members:

The similarity of a seasonal to a quarterly renewal license has in a general way occasion-is policy. First, to explain the quarterly renewal license, we refer to the Gaming Act and to an 'ney General's opinion relative to the renewal of a license. In these cases the law provides that the see may renew by the payment of the proper fees and the Attorney General has further clarified by stating that renewal cannot be denied a licensee without cause and due process. A seasonal see does not enjoy this legal status but its position, practically evaluated, is similar and has been need under this premise in the past.

Legally, a seasonal license can be evaluated at the beginning of each season as a new se, but an abrupt change in procedure at the opening of a new season would not appear to be comly justified, provided the record of performance during the past season has been acceptable.

However, an approval of seasonal licenses at this time without clarification might carry and the implication that the same premise will apply to the ensuing season. This would place a iction upon the Gaming Commission which assumes licensing responsibility on July 1st. The ng Commission and Control Board should not be hampered by this premise the following season.

For that reason, and in fairness to current seasonal applicants in that they might be properly advised, ove that this application (Bal Tabarin), being the first seasonal license in this general category to before us, be approved.

But, further, that subsequent applications may be evaluated as a new license in accordance with tre policies and standards of the Nevada Gaming Commission and Control Board.

The following statement of policy was expressed regarding nonrestricted gaming in the catact area:

"In the past it has been the feeling of both the Gaming Control Board and the Tax Commission that nonrestricted gaming, as opposed to slot machines only, would not be approved in the Contact, Nevada area, a sparsely populated border location, due to the fact that it was considered too remote to be adequately policed. More recently a special deputy sheriff has been stationed there, and enforcement heads have stated that additional deputies will be added if needed.

CONTACT - NONRESTRICTED GAMING

'Subsequently, the actual point on the Nevada-Idaho stateline at which the several clubs are located was named Jackpot, Nevada; and the Board is presently considering several applications for nonrestricted gaming there.

'It is the Board's present feeling that inasmuch as nonrestricted gaming has been or is presently licensed at McDermitt, Mt. Montgomery Pass, Mountain City, Mesquite, Wendove Verdi and Topaz Lodge, Nevada, all border towns in a somewhat comparable situation to that of Jackpot, consistency on a state level would appear to indicate a change in the Board's former policy relative to Contact and Jackpot.

"This statement is made from the standpoint of state licensing only, bearing in mind that the overall consideration of whether it is the desire of local authorities to expand from restricted to nonrestricted gaming in this area can more properly be made by the local authorities themselves."

# ZEPHYR COVE, LAKE TAHOE - NONRESTRICTED GAMING

Reference was made to the recent controversy at 7ephyr Cove as to whether additional slot machines shall be permitted there in some of the existing clubs and also whether non-restricted gaming will be permitted there. In view of the public interest, the Board made inquiry of various people at that point, the results of which Mr. Gallagher presented. The situation was precipitated by a request for a change in zoning variance which would permit nonrestricted gaming ther the present variance permitting the operation of slot machines without limiting the number. Mr. Gallagher reported that the Presbyterian Church, which owns property in the area, is opposed to gaming as a matter of religious principle and because of the deleterious effect it feels it would have on its property. Also opposed to nonrestricted gaming are two organized groups of home owners as

well as other individual home owners. Those in favor of the variance change seem to be primarily

small business people and those associated with the gambling industry, who feel that gaming habilit up the Lake area and that it would be discriminatory to permit gaming to be confined to to Stateline area and in the hands of a few operators.

As to the Board, the nonrestricted gaming issue at 7ephyr Cove is most at the present since both the Douglas County Planning Board and the Douglas County Commissioners have unanimously denied the change of variance; and, in addition, the Board has before it only an application for an increase in number of slot machines. The opponents of the variance are concerned only with nonrestricted gaming. It was agreed the results of the survey would be presented to the Gaming Commission.

# KENO GAMES

It was mentioned that in recent months the Board has received several complaints condisputed keno payments which have entailed lengthy investigative hearings; with the result that Board now is considering the feasibility of requiring keno operators to install methods which we enable the Board to make a more positive determination as to whether the house or the complaints in the right. The Board expects to have shortly suggestions and possibly requirements in the regard.
